

EPUD QUICK FACTS

- Year Started: 1983
- Number of Employees: 74
- Territory Size: 555 Square Miles
- Line Information: There are 1,883 miles of distribution line and 21 miles of transmission line in EPUD's district, with 24,618 distribution poles and 372 transmission poles
- Approximate Customer Number: 20,000
- Substation Locations: Marcola, Pleasant Hill, Creswell, Cheshire, Powerline, Noti, and Latham

Towns Served: Towns inside EPUD's district are Alvadore, Cheshire, Crow, Dexter, Elmira, Fall Creek, Goshen, Jasper, Lorane, Marcola, Pleasant Hill, Saginaw, and Veneta; and parts of Coburg, Cottage Grove, Creswell, Eugene, Halsey, Junction City, Lowell, and Springfield

Power Resources: We get most of our electricity from the federal dams on the Columbia River, managed by the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA). Our Short Mountain Methane Power Plant generates a small amount of electricity from the decaying garbage at the landfill. We also offer our customers the option of buying renewable power, bringing more wind and geothermal energy to the Northwest power grid.

PUBLIC POWER QUICK FACTS

- More than 45 Million Americans are now served by PUBLIC Power - that is almost 15% of all consumers
- There are more than 2,000 PUBLIC power systems in the U.S. in every state but Hawaii
- Some of the nation's largest cities - Los Angeles, San Antonio, Seattle and Orlando, operate PUBLIC electric utilities
- PRIVATE power customers pay an average of 14% more than PUBLIC power customers
- PUBLIC power pays about 5.0% of its electric operating revenues to its cities and states, which is 19% higher than revenues and fees paid by PRIVATE power companies.
